Policy Statement

Magna Learning Partnership (MLP) has uniform for the following reasons:

Belonging

School uniform plays an important role in promoting pride, self-confidence, and a feeling of belonging and cohesion within the student body.

Safety

If all the learners in our schools wear a clearly recognisable uniform, it is easy to identify strangers. On the way to and from the school it also affords a degree of safety as the learners are part of a large body of young people and will look out for each other.

Preparation for the future

Many careers require staff to wear a uniform and even if there is not a uniform there is often a dress code. School uniform helps learners get used to dressing to a prescribed standard. It also helps them know the difference between formal and informal dress.

Value for money

Good quality uniform is a relatively inexpensive way of dressing for school. It is also very robust and easy to launder.

It makes preparation in the morning easier

Learners only must think about their uniform and not alternatives, removing the additional pressures of deciding what to wear and the added stress this may cause.

Readiness for learning

Putting on a uniform is a signal you are ready to learn.

A sense of pride

We all feel proud of our learners when they are well dressed in their uniforms. PE uniforms also help to demonstrate pride in their school.

Responsibilities

The Trust Board of Magana Learning Partnership agrees that a School Uniform Policy is in the best interest of all stakeholders. It is mindful that uniform requires a financial outlay by families and will ensure that all costs are kept to a minimum. School specific branded uniform items will be kept to a minimum (usually one item in primary schools and a maximum of three items for secondaries.) Schools will also ensure uniform is easily available within the locality.

MLP schools will support families and the environment through encouraging the recycling of uniform items. These are normally available from your child's school on request.

It is the [Headteacher's](#) responsibility to ensure that the Uniform Policy is upheld and maintained. This responsibility is delegated to all staff.

The Headteacher's decision on the appropriateness of uniform is final. Parents may wish to appeal a decision. This can be done through the MLP Complaints Policy. A copy of which can be found on the website.

All **members of staff** are responsible for implementing the standards of the policy and will always enforce the expectations, ensuring it is worn properly and encouraging learners to do so with pride. Tutors and Heads of House are expected to be particularly vigilant.

Parents are expected to ensure learners have, and wear, the correct uniform and should ensure all uniform is clearly labelled. Should an item of uniform need replacing we ask this to be done at the earliest opportunity.

Learners are expected to familiarise themselves with, and wear, the correct uniform always in accordance with the Uniform Standards. Learners who identify as transgender or gender non-binary are welcome to adhere to this dress code as appropriate to their gender identity.

Uniform Standards

Learners must always wear correct school uniform; this includes correct footwear. On PE days, children come to school in their PE kit, ensuring all items adhere to the policy.

Learners are required to remove coats and place them on their allocated pegs before entering the classroom.

Uniform is routinely checked. Staff will request that any changes are made as necessary. Non-compliance with the uniform policy is investigated on a case-by-case basis and discussions with parents will be held regarding any persistent breaches of the policy.

In Year 6, children are presented with a school tie. This should be worn on every day that children are in normal school uniform, except in cases when (optional) dresses are worn.
